Abstract

The international event is organized as an independent conference by several EU funded projects dealing with communication technologies and how they can be integrated to provide value-added services in transport logistics. The conference topics are focused on addressing current and future issues and challenges for stakeholders in this sector and currently and future available solutions regarding increased efficiency and sustainability in logistics. The target audience includes all stakeholders in the area of transport logistics, e.g. logistics operators, industry, infrastructure providers and authorities, but also researchers and experts.

For the keynotes we have invited speakers from the EC and politics, as well experts from research and industry to underline the importance of the current and future challenges faced by the transportation industry.
